Panel Discussion on University Autonomy and Funding

The panelists

Andreas Demetriou is Professor Emeritus of the University of Nicosia and President of the Cyprus Academy of Science, Letters, and Arts. He is a fellow of Academia Europaea, the International Academy of Education, an Honorary Doctor of Middlesex University London. He was Acting Rector of the University of Cyprus, foundational President of the Cyprus University of Technology, President of the Conference of Rectors of the Universities of Cyprus, and Minister of Education and Culture of Cyprus (2008–2011).

Joachim Funke is Professor Emeritus of the University of Heidelberg. His research covers several fields of Cognitive Psychology, focusing on complex problem solving. His work on the conception of dynamic problem solving and its computer-based assessment has had an enormous impact internationally. Dynamic problem solving became part of the PISA 2012 assessments, when he was the chairman of the Expert Group on Problem Solving. In 2015 he received a Doctor Honoris Causa from the University of Szeged, Hungary.

Andreas Frommer is Professor of Applied Computer Science at the Department of Mathematics at Wuppertal University, Wuppertal, Germany. His research areas are in numerical linear algebra methods for parallel High-Performance Computing with particular emphasis on simulations in lattice chromodynamics. He was the long-time director of the Institute for Applied Informatics at Wuppertal University. For 12 years he is a member of the rectorate of Wuppertal University as vice rector for academic affairs.

Terezinha Nunes is Emeritus Professor of Educational Studies and a Fellow of Harris-Manchester College of the University of Oxford. Her work spans the domains of children's literacy and numeracy with a special interest in educational applications. In 2017 she was awarded the Hans Freudenthal award for innovative and influential research in mathematics education, by the International Union of Mathematicians. In 2018 she received a Doctor Honoris Causa from the University of Szeged, Hungary.

Patrik Scheinin is Professor of Education at the University of Helsinki. He was the Dean of the Faculty of Educational Sciences of the University of Helsinki for three periods (2007-2018); under his leadership the faculty reached the 38th position in international rankings - and is still rising. He was a chair of the Finnish Matriculation Examination Board and of the Board of the Helsinki Collegium for Advanced Studies. He is a founding member of the Centre for Educational Assessment at the University of Helsinki.
